Scarborough 400: Celebrating the original seaside resort

This toolkit will equip you with everything you need to mark this landmark year. Inside, you'll find a brief history of Scarborough's rise as a popular seaside resort, logos and images for promotional use, and details on how to join in the anniversary celebrations.

Background to Scarborough 400

You can use this copy to help promote Scarborough and its anniversary. Feel free to tweak it to match your tone of voice but please don't change the key facts:

Scarborough's spa legacy began in 1626 when Thomasin Farrer discovered mineral springs beneath the cliffs near to the Scarborough Spa. These waters, which stained the rocks a russet colour, tasted slightly bitter and were discovered to cure minor ailments. Neighbours and friends were told about the beneficial effects and soon, 'drinking the waters' became the accepted medicine for Scarborough's townspeople. Dr. Robert Wittie published a book about the waters in 1660, and Scarborough soon transformed into a fashionable health resort.

By 1700, local entrepreneur Dicky Dickinson had built the first spa buildings and introduced a fee for visitors to "take the waters," laying the foundation for Scarborough's reputation as a health retreat and paving the way for its status as "Britain's first seaside resort". Today, the original spa complex, Scarborough Spa, is a cultural and performance venue, hosting a range of events from comedy nights and pantomimes to conventions, as well as the last remaining seaside orchestra who perform during the summer months.

To commemorate the 400-year anniversary of Scarborough becoming a Spa town, a year-long celebration is planned for 2026 with a programme of vibrant events such as exhibitions, culture and arts, family entertainment and community trails. An artist will also be commissioned to create a heritage installation which will become a permanent feature at Scarborough Spa.

Together, these efforts aim to honour the town's rich past while shining a spotlight on Scarborough as a must-visit destination.

Enjoy world-class live music at the Open Air Theatre - the largest of its kind in Europe - and be entertained by a wide range of events and performances, from comedy to pantomimes, at the historic Scarborough Spa.

Be dazzled by the arts and culture of The Scarborough Fair, featuring street entertainment, fringe performances, and spectacular light displays that bring the town to life year-round.

For moments of tranquillity, explore South Cliff Gardens, with peaceful woodland trails, a charming rose garden, and sweeping sea views. In North Bay, Peasholm Park enchants visitors with its oriental landscaping, boating lake, and putting green. Each summer, the famous Naval Warfare display offers a unique spectacle that has delighted generations for years.

Culture thrives here, too. Explore the collections at the town's museums and galleries or catch cutting-edge drama and comedy at the renowned Stephen Joseph Theatre, birthplace of Sir Alan Ayckbourn's plays.

2026 is a landmark year for Scarborough as it celebrates 400 years since the discovery of its spa waters, a moment that shaped the town's history and established it as one of England's first seaside resorts.
